



The Nature and Meaning of Grand Strategy

- Goal-setting and goal achievement at the largest scale and into the indefinite future.
- Preoccupation with process and means is tactical; preoccupation with outcomes and future context is strategic.

Grand Strategy

Policies remain unchanged until destroyed by realities, usually generated by external forces

Grand Strategy

- 1. Achieves situational awareness in the broadest and deepest senses.
- 2. Defines national goals in the short-, medium, and long-term.
- 3. Coordinates goal-setting and implementation using strategic information dominance (ID) as its principal organising tool.

The Next Era of Global Security


The second half of the 20th Century was characterized by unprecedented increase in scale married to several equally unprecedented, absolutely mutually-reinforcing and interdependent phenomena

The Next Era of Global Security

- 1. Compounding technological evolution;
- 2. Dramatically rising per capita wealth;
- 3. Scaling of an open global trading and supply chain architecture;
- 4. The urbanisation of the majority of the population; and
- 5. The temporary bubble of the trebling of the world's population.

Addressing the Dangers of a Terrorism-Preoccupied Era

Reaction is not a war-winning strategy or a strategy for national or global leadership.

The "Terrorism Era"

No terrorist phenomenon has ever sustained itself for any meaningful duration — or achieved strategic outcomes — in the absence of support from a nation-state or wealthy society

Strategic Will: Back to Fundamentals
